Information Students May Need to Know about Their Parent(s) or Legal Guardian(s) to Complete an Apply Idaho Application

➔ Did your parent or legal guardian complete a four-year degree?

Some institutions offer scholarships or grants to first-generation college students. If you live with and receive support from parents or legal guardians and neither of them obtained a four-year degree, then you are a first-generation college student. If you only live with one parent or legal guardian and they did not obtain a four-year degree, then you are also a first generation college student.

NO Are you a first-generation student?

*You are a first-generation student if:
You live with or receive support from both parents and neither parent completed a baccalaureate degree.
- or -
You live with or receive support from only one parent and that parent did not complete a baccalaureate degree.*

➔ Did your parent or legal guardian graduate from an Idaho college or university?

Make sure you know if your parent or legal guardian graduated from an Idaho institution. Some Idaho institutions provide scholarships to students whose parents graduated from their institution.
